Placer County Community Themes and Strengths Assessment

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<u>Background</u>

From May 2016-October 2016, the Placer County Public Health Division, through the Be Well Placer initiative, surveyed people who live, work, learn, or play in Placer County to obtain more information about health and quality of life issues in the community. Be Well Placer is a community-driven strategic planning process for improving community health that uses the Mobilizing for Action through Planning and Partnerships (MAPP) framework. MAPP is not an agencyfocused assessment process; rather it is a six-phase interactive process that can improve the efficiency, effectiveness, and performance of local public health systems. In accordance with this framework, Be Well Placer will incorporate the findings from the Community Themes and Strengths Assessment (CTSA) with the three remaining assessments to identify strategic issues and formulate goals and strategies to address them.

Introduction: What is a Community Themes and Strengths Assessment (CTSA)?

The purpose of the CTSA is to receive insight from the community about important community health and quality of life issues. The CTSA also explores the community's opinion towards community assets, community concerns, and their perceptions about the health factors and health outcomes of Placer County. The results will help guide the "Identify Strategic Issues" phase of the MAPP process.

<u>Methodology</u>

Multiple surveys were distributed to complete the CTSA for Placer County. Using surveys from other local counties as examples, the CTSA survey was drafted by the Be Well Placer Core Team (internal public health staff) and presented to the Be Well Placer committee. Committee members had two opportunities to provide feedback on the survey, once during a Be Well Placer meeting and then one final time via email. Once the survey was finalized, Be Well Placer committee members were asked to distribute the electronic version of the survey to all partner organizations and individuals in Placer County. They were also encouraged to share the survey link via their professional and/or personal social media sites. The Core Team distributed the survey in a variety of manners, including but not limited to the Placer County E-News, Placer Collaborative Network email list serve, Campaign for Community Wellness email list serve, Placer Network of Care website, Placer County website, Placer County social media sites (Facebook and Twitter), and a local press release.

The Spanish translation of the same survey was administered via paper survey by the Latino Leadership Council. From May 2016 to October 2016, a total of 1,145 respondents completed either the English-version or Spanish-version CTSA survey. Statistical analyses of the survey are on pages 2 to 10 of this report.

Additionally, a qualitative key informant survey to access health and quality of life in Placer County was administered to senior adults at a health and wellness fair in September 2016. Content analysis for the key informant survey is on page 10 of the report. Respondents for any of the surveys had to either live, work, learn, or play in Placer County in order to be eligible to participate.

Data Limitations

One limitation of the CTSA is that the primary opportunity to participate in the CTSA survey was electronically. While this does allow for a broad participation it may not include those who do not have access to the internet, or those who are not on the particular email distribution lists that were selected. Additionally, the Spanish CTSA surveys and the key informant surveys were collected using convenience sampling. Another limitation is that some participants selected more than three answer choices for questions 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, and 8 in the CTSA survey. If this occurred, each response provided was entered.

Findings

Placer County Public Health and the Be Well Placer Committee acknowledge these findings do not reflect the performance or capacity of any single agency or organization.


Note: Throughout this assessment, 'n' refers to the number of individuals who responded to a particular CTSA question. All percentages were rounded to the tenth decimal place.

Demographics


Race and ethnicity (n=1002). Approximately 80.4% of respondents self-identified as White/Caucasian, 11.0% self-identified as Hispanic/Latino, and 2.5% self-identified as Asian. Additional respondents self-identified as Black/African American, Native American, Pacific Islander, and Other.

Age (n=1002). Over 40% of respondents were between 40 years old to 54 years old. A total of 25.0% of survey respondents were 55 years old to 64 years old, followed by 23.1% of respondents who were 26 years old to 39 years old.



Gender (n=1003). Almost 78.0% of those surveyed self-identified as female. A total of 21.4% of respondents self-identified as male, and 0.9% self-identified as other.




Language spoken at home (n=1003). The CTSA survey shows that 94.4% of respondents speak English at home, 8.7% of respondents speak Spanish at home, and less than 0.5% of respondents speak Russian at home. Nearly 2.0% of survey respondents speak other languages at home, which include but aren't limited to: American Sign Language, Farsi, French, Hindi, Japanese, and Tagalog.

Education, Income, and Household Information

Highest educational level (n=1000). Of the CTSA respondents who reported their highest educational level, 40.7% obtained a college degree, and 24.8% finished a graduate or professional degree. Approximately 24.0% of respondents completed some college, and 6.5% acquired their high school diploma.




Highest Educational Level (n=1000)

Household income (n=999). Exactly 24.3% of survey respondents have an annual household income that ranges from \$100,000 to \$149,000; subsequently 18.1% of respondents have an annual household income range of \$50,000-\$74,999. Note that almost 6.0% of respondents have an annual household income of less than \$25,000.

Household size (n=1004). Over 48.0% of CTSA respondents have a household size of 1-2 people. About 41.0% of respondents have a household size of 3-4 people, and 9.7% have 5-6 people residing in their household. The mode household size is 7 people for those who selected "other."




Household Size (n=1004)

Household location (n=1141). Respondents were allowed to participate in the CTSA if they lived, worked, learned, or played in Placer County. Of those who provided an accurate household zip code, 83.3% reside in Placer County, 6.7% reside in Sacramento County, and 6.2% reside in Nevada County. Additional respondents reside in Amador County, Contra Costa County, El Dorado County, Mendocino County, Solano County, Sutter County, and Yuba County. Residents from Nevada and Oregon also participated in the survey.

Personal Health

Personal health status (n=1143). Over one-half of respondents (54.2%) labeled their personal health status as "excellent" or "very good." A total of 35.7% of respondents disclosed their health status as "good" while 10% stated their health status was either "fair" or "poor."



Public Health Concerns

Respondents of the CTSA answered the following questions about various public health concerns in Placer County:

- "What do you think are the three biggest health problems in your area?"
- "What do you think are three 'risky' behaviors that most negatively affect health in your community?"
- "What do you think are the three biggest social and economic problems that affect health in your community?"
- "What do you think are the three biggest environmental issues in your community?"
- "Do any of the following make it hard for you to access health care services?"

The top three responses for each question will be interpreted.

Perceived Health Issues (n=1094). Over half of the respondents (51.4%) believe that mental health issues, such as depression, are the biggest health problems in Placer County. Furthermore, 43.1% of respondents state that obesity and alcoholism (27.0%) are additional top health issues in the area.

Perceived Health Behaviors (n=1076). When asked about risky behaviors that most negatively affect health in the community, CTSA respondents selected drug abuse (44.3%), driving while drunk and/or on drugs (38.2%), and poor eating habits (37.4%).

Perceived Social and Economic Circumstances (n=1046). A total of 48.1% of respondents state the lack of affordable housing is the biggest social and economic circumstance that affects health in the community. Next, homelessness (44.4%) and not enough local jobs (27.8%) are social and economic circumstances that affect health in Placer County.

Perceived Environmental Concerns (n=1017). Almost 45.0% of respondents indicated that speeding and traffic is the biggest environmental issue in the community, followed by air pollution (37.6%), and not having enough sidewalks or bike paths (35.8%).

Perceived Healthcare Barriers (n=1010). The majority of respondents (68.7%) do not have difficulty accessing health care services. However, for those who did express difficulty accessing health care services, 11.7% attributed the difficulty to high co-pays and deductibles, 10.4% stated the difficulty is due to the lack of doctors in Placer County, and 10.3% expressed that the wait time to see the doctor is too long.



Overall Community Health

Healthy, Thriving Community (n=1016). Respondents were asked to select the most important factors of a healthy, thriving community. The top three factors were job opportunities (36.3%), low crime and safe neighborhoods (35.0%), and affordable housing (32.9%).



Community Environment for Children (n=1009). When asked to agree or disagree with the statement that the community is a good place to raise children, 80.9% of respondents either agreed or strongly agreed.




Community Environment for Children (n=1009)


Community Environment for Aging (n=1008). A total of 54.4% of respondents either agree or strongly agree with the statement that Placer County is a good place to age (with consideration to elder-friendly housing, transportation to medical services and shopping, elder day care, social support, etc.)



Healthy City (n=1010). The survey shows that 52.4% of respondents rate their city as a healthy place to live. About one-third of participants rate their city as a somewhat healthy place to live (30.1%).



Healthy County (n=1006). Placer County is a healthy place to live, according to 57.7% of survey respondents. A total of 25.1% of respondents rate the county as a somewhat healthy place to live, followed by 15.1% of respondents who believe the county is a very healthy place to live. Just over 2% of respondents rate Placer County as either an unhealthy or very unhealthy place to live.



Key Informant Survey

As previously mentioned, 19 qualitative surveys were obtained at the Sierra College Health and Wellness Fair to access the health and quality of life in Placer County. Survey participants were attendees of the health fair who were senior adults.

When asked about what comes to mind when picturing a healthy community, participants mentioned safety, green space, recreational activities, and community support. The participants were most proud of the residents in Placer County and the low crime rates in the county. However, the participants believe that Placer County can improve their efforts on homelessness, community access to illegal substances, transportation, and the lack of access to affordable foods.

Looking to the future, the participants would support care for children and seniors as an action, policy, or funding priority followed by tobacco laws, community support for healthier foods, and transportation. Finally, the initiatives that the participants would like to be involved in include environmental issues, multi-unit housing regulations prohibiting tobacco, volunteerism, and volunteer opportunities for college students and children.

Conclusion

Data from the CTSA survey and the Key Informant Survey indicate the health factors and health outcomes that respondents believe are fundamental for a healthy community. As a result, this objective summary report and the reports

from the three accompanying MAPP assessments will be used to inform strategic plans in Placer County. It is recommended that community members continue to be identified as active partners and important collaborators as the strategic plans are created and implemented throughout the county.
